

A message from the President:

Hello PPOA Members! We are only a few days before the July 4<sup>th</sup> weekend, and I want to give you a quick update on the happenings of the organization. I also want to welcome April Powell as our most recent PPOA Board Member.

The 2022 PPOA facility rental season is well underway. Obviously, there was some disappointment about the decision not to rent all of our facilities (<https://potawatomipropertyowners.com/wp-content/uploads/2022/01/Rental-Program-Resolution.pdf>), but we are definitely focused on producing a positive financial benefit this year, as opposed to the losses the program has experienced in the past. I am happy to report that focusing on the three larger units has allowed us to make some improvements and we have already outpaced 2019 and 2020 in rental revenue! We still struggle finding volunteers to help clean, maintain and improve the facilities, but we keep plugging along. Remember, there are no paid employees of Potawatomi. Aside from one casual 1099 contractor, everything you see is done through the graciousness of our volunteers. The Campground is open and receiving reservations. The shower building at the Campground is open 24/7 until September, and we encourage our members to check it out. If you desire to use the showers, please remember that YOU are responsible for keeping the facility clean and that you MUST remove any personal items after each use. Remember, there are no employees that will be cleaning up behind you. Members are responsible for keeping the building clean so we can continue to keep it open.

Last, a general safety and security reminder for all of our members and guests: If you feel unsafe at any time or if you see criminal activity, **PLEASE CALL 911 or the Bayfield County Sheriff's Office**. Only law enforcement can intervene in unlawful situations and situations where in individual's or a group's activities make you feel unsafe. PPOA does not have any employees, nor is it appropriate for volunteer staff to intervene in situations that clearly call for law enforcement. I have asked the Board members to inform all members and their guests to **CALL 911 or the Bayfield County Sheriff's Office** if there are situations requiring enforcement of ordinances, laws or inappropriate behavior. **DO NOT CALL THE PPOA VOICE MAIL PHONE NUMBER** to report situations that require immediate intervention by law enforcement.
